CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

The following information is provided in the hope of making the school charges and contributions structure clear for parents and carers. Atwell College has directed our efforts towards keeping costs as low and as equitable as possible. The Atwell College Board and Finance Committee have examined the contributions and charges structure in detail and approved the amounts shown in accordance with the School Education Act 1999.

The State Government through the Department of Education provides placement at educational facilities for all students who choose to attend public schools. The Department also pays for the wages of all teaching and school support staff plus costs such as repairs, maintenance and utilities. Government does not provide for many goods and services which students use and it is reasonable for parents to meet these costs.

Contributions and charges go towards a variety of consumable items across learning areas, including Science chemicals, art equipment, ingredients for cooking, student project materials and photocopying.

How much can be charged?

For Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 the maximum voluntary contributions a school may charge is currently fixed at \$235.00, however additional compulsory charges above that figure can be requested for consumables and additional resources. The school can also request a 50% confirmation charge for these years.

Collecting Contributions & Charges

Given that all students benefit from the pool of collected fees, it is fair to expect that all parents should pay the balance of contributions and charges. This college is committed to an even-handed and responsible approach and it is our expectation that all parents should make contributions towards their children's education.

Atwell College is aware that the payment of contributions and charges can be a financial burden for some families. Part payments, deferred payments and credit card debits are all available to support parents experiencing difficulties. Please contact our Accounts on 086174 2200 to discuss payment options. The college is keen to assist parents in selecting options that they can afford. To this end, subject charges will always be provided to parents prior to selection of subjects. The College Board and the Finance Committee have endorsed and passed all subjects costs charged by the college.

COMPULSORY CHARGES

Extra cost optional courses outside the basic core program incur additional charges above the voluntary contribution of \$235.00. Subjects such as Sports, Visual Art and Food, attract compulsory charges for items such as consumable materials and venue hire. Charges relate to items that students consume over and above what is supplied by the Department of Education and Training. Parents are provided estimated costs for these elective subjects during the Subject Selection process. Please note that there are low-cost subject options available as well.

There are no maximum charges set by the State Government. Charges the college has set for the courses are **compulsory** and will depend on the course chosen. Some specific courses will incur higher costs dependent on such items as text, subject-specific resources, materials, excursions, Certificates and work placement.

50% payment is required by Friday 8 December 2023 to confirm placement in selected courses with the balance of payment due by Friday 23 February 2024.

SPECIALIST PROGRAMMES

Instrumental Music, STEM, Netball and Rugby League are offered as specialist programmes at Atwell College and will incur additional charges above the voluntary contribution. Charges for Specialist Programmes are required to be paid by Friday 23 February 2024.

BOOKLIST AND PERSONAL ITEMS

Recommended personal and stationery items will be detailed on the booklist sheet. Items may be purchased from Champion (our preferred supplier) or parent/carers have the option of purchasing the required equipment independently.

EDUCATION PROGRAMME ALLOWANCE

Closing Date Thursday 28 March 2024 (to be confirmed)

The Education Program Allowance (part of the Secondary Assistance Scheme) is available to secondary students whose parent/carer holds a Centrelink Family Health Care Card, a Pensioner Concession Card or a Veteran's Affairs Pensioner Concession Card. The scheme is available to students up to and including the year in which they turn 18 years of age.

Applications are made by the parent or carer for students enrolled in Years 7 - 12. It is preferable that applications are made prior to the beginning of the school year or as early as possible in Term One. Application forms are available from the college administration and these forms must be submitted prior to the end of Term One 2024.

- \$235.00 Education Program Allowance paid directly to the college
- \$115.00 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/ carer or the college, with the provision to use this towards school fees if not used for the college uniform.

The Education Program Allowance will be paid directly to the college and will be applied to voluntary contributions for Year 7 – 10 (For those parents/carers who elect to pay their clothing allowance to the college, these funds will be deducted from the compulsory charges first.). For Year 11 and 12 students in receipt of the allowance, the money will be applied towards their compulsory charges.

Processing of Payments

Schools Resourcing and Budgeting Directorate will endeavour to have all clothing payments made to the parent/carer by 31 May 2024 (to be confirmed).

Late Applications

Late applications will only be accepted in extenuating circumstances and must be accompanied with a written explanation. Eligible interstate or overseas students who are enrolled after first term may apply for the allowance. Date of enrolment must be noted on the application.

VOLUNTARY APPROVED REQUESTS

Under government guidelines, the College requests a Voluntary Contribution of up to \$235.00 for each student. These contributions are used to provide resources for the compulsory learning areas: Mathematics, English, Science, Humanities and Social Sciences, Technologies, the Arts, Health & Physical Education and Languages. The payment of Voluntary Contributions will make a significant contribution to the quality of educational programs delivered. There is an expectation that families who can afford to pay the Voluntary Contributions do so.

Bus Replacement

A contribution of \$10.00 for replacement of the college buses over a 10-year period. On many excursions, the college buses are used to reduce costs for hiring external buses.

Chaplaincy Contribution

A contribution of \$25.00 is requested to support the presence of a non-denominational chaplain who is an integral part of the college's Student Services program and is not an employee of the Department of Education (*this contribution may be tax deductible*).

Information Technology

The Information Technology contribution is \$15.00. The college uses this money to purchase items needed for using computers and to upgrade computers throughout the college.

Library Contribution

The Library contribution is \$25.00 and goes towards the purchase of periodicals, books and other library resources. The Department of Education provides limited funding to provide resources for this centre.

P&C Contribution

A contribution of \$25.00 is requested to support the P&C in developing fundraising programs and supporting the Atwell College community.

OTHER COSTS

Smartrider Cards

Smartrider cards are issued to all new students following the completion of a Smartrider Application form. The Smartrider card is free, however, the cost of a replacement card is \$5.00.

Safety Glasses

It is a safety requirement for students to supply their own 'Approved Safety Glasses' for all Design and Technology classes.

Contributions

Contributions in WA Public Schools are set at a maximum of \$235.00 per student for a nominal curriculum. Funds raised from school charges are expended on texts, resources and equipment essential for curriculum delivery and which are not supplied by the government.

Textbooks

In some instances, textbooks are made available to students as class sets in order to minimise costs for parents/carers. Please be aware that a replacement cost will be charged if a textbook is lost or badly damaged.

Calculators

Year 7 to Year 10: A scientific calculator is required – see Champion Booklist (to be provided in Term 3 2023).

Optional

Other optional costs include but are not limited to camps, excursions, performances, rewards excursions, college balls, college photos and workshops.

Overview

The focus of schooling in Year 10 is to continue to develop broad educational knowledge and skills.

All students in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 will be required to enrol in compulsory courses each year. These compulsory courses include English, Science, Mathematics, Humanities and Social Sciences, and Health and Physical Education. These courses will become increasingly challenging as students move up the year levels. Contributions and charges for these courses will be detailed on a fee sheet which will be posted to parents/carers after student subject selections are finalised.

Specialist Programmes

The following programmes are designed to meet the needs of selected students in a particular area of the curriculum.

Academic Extension Programme (AEP)

At Atwell College, our Academic Extension Programme (AEP) is designed to challenge students academically and build on their self-management and reflection skills, developing well rounded independent learners. The College offers Academic Extension classes in four learning areas: English, Humanities and Social Sciences, Mathematics and Science. Placement in these classes is reviewed at the end of every semester.

Education Support

Atwell College caters for students with a full spectrum of disabilities; from severe intellectually disabled individuals with complex needs in a specialist building to students with mild disabilities in small classes in general learning areas. There is a focus on student centered planning that encompasses the academic programmes as well as social emotional wellbeing of students.

The Kim Beazley Learning Centre (KBLC) building is a purpose built, safe facility for students with special needs. The building is equipped with a hydrotherapy pool, specialist sensory equipment and life skills training rooms and can cater for therapists who attend the school.

Netball Specialist Programme (NSP) (only available to previously selected students)

Atwell College is endorsed as a Tier 1 Specialist Netball School by Netball Western Australia. This endorsement recognises the Netball Specialist Programme as one of the Top 5 Specialist Netball School Programmes in the state. Students have the opportunity to excel in the sport as athletes, coaches, umpires and officials for the future. Knowledge, strategies and tactics of Netball are assimilated in a progressive way to ensure athletes move from a basic to an advanced level.

Rugby League Specialist Programme (RLSP) (only available to previously selected students)

Atwell College is one of Western Australia's leading Rugby League schools. The school-based Rugby League Specialist Programme is an elite sporting programme developed by Atwell College in conjunction with the National Rugby League Western Australia. The programme helps engage students at school and provides outstanding opportunities to develop specific skills, knowledge and experiences.

Elective Subjects 2024

In addition to the compulsory courses for all students, Year 9 students will be able to choose from an additional selection of elective courses.

All elective selections are completed using the Subject Selection Online (SSO) system. Information on how to access and use SSO will be issued via the student DOE email address as shown in the college database. Please ensure that these details are up to date.

Using the SSO system, students will rank their preferred electives for the year from 1 to 10. The elective subjects listed in this handbook will only operate next year if they attract sufficient numbers. The ranked list will assist in placing students in the next available subject, so preferred rankings should be completed thoughtfully.

Where it is not specifically indicated, semester electives will run in either Semester 1 or Semester 2. More details will be provided when selecting electives in SSO.

HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Basketball - Semester Elective – 10BBL7/8

- 2023 Course Indicated cost \$30 per semester

In this course, students will learn the fundamentals of Basketball and engage in a variety of different Basketball activities and games designed to enhance their skills. We aim to foster opportunities for talented players to participate in competitive Basketball tournaments and help them develop the skills and values such as respect, leadership, teamwork and discipline to be demonstrated in a team environment. This option should only be selected by students who will be active participants and are genuinely interested in the game of Basketball.

Girls Rugby League - Semester Elective – 10GRL7/8

- 2023 Course Indicated cost \$35 per semester

Girls Rugby League is an elite sporting course developed by Atwell College in conjunction with the National Rugby League Western Australia. This course provides outstanding opportunities to develop specific skills, knowledge and experiences. These include game skills, fitness and theory sessions aimed at developing the knowledge of the game and becoming a professional athlete, including nutrition, refereeing and coaching.

The course includes coaching from NRL WA coaches and professionals, competing in competitions (NRL sanctioned) and individual interschool matches and opportunities to coach and referee at primary school events.

Human Movement - Semester Elective – 10HUM7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$30 per semester
- Prerequisite: B grade or higher in Year 9 Physical Education or Year 9 Netball or Rugby League Specialist Programme

Human Movement has both a theoretical and practical component that allows physically active and sports minded students an opportunity to learn about how humans create movement and cope with the demands of exercise. Students will also have an opportunity to participate in practical based sessions that help develop understanding of class concepts and give them a chance to demonstrate their ability in a sporting context. This course will be useful for those students who intend to study courses in the Physical Education pathway in either ATAR, General or Certificate courses for Year 11 and 12.

Netball Specialist Programme - Year Elective – 10NSP7/8

Rugby League Specialist Programme - Year Elective – 10RLS7/8

- Netball 2023 Course cost \$304 per year
- Rugby League 2023 Course cost \$75 per year
- Prerequisite: C grade or higher in Year 9 Netball or Rugby League Specialist Programme

Students are selected based on their athletic ability, skill level, behaviour, grades and commitment. See information on the College website for further details.

Outdoor Education - Semester Elective – 10OED7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$75 per semester

Students who enjoy outdoor activities and learning about how we can interact safely with the natural environment may be interested in selecting Outdoor Education (OE) as an option in Year 10. These entry level courses have both a practical and theoretical element to them that will give students some insight and skill sets to follow their interest in OE through to Year 11 and 12, in courses such as Outdoor Recreation (Certificate II) and General Outdoor Education.

Specialised Health Education - Semester Elective – 10SHE7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$30 per semester
- Prerequisite: B grade or higher in Year 9 Health Education

Specialised Health Education is for students who are considering studying Health Studies in Year 11 and 12. Students will develop critical health literacy through a range of activities conducted in both practical and theoretical contexts. Main areas of focus will be mass media health campaigns, population health data, national health priority areas, self-management and interpersonal skills.

HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCE

Career and Business Studies - Semester Elective – 10CBS7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$16 per semester

Students will learn valuable skills that will help with their personal and career development in a rapidly changing world. The course will cover topics such as personal finance, budgeting, use of Microsoft Office, business recordkeeping and managing their career. Students will be taught the practical skills required in today's workplaces and explore different career pathways they may be suited to.

LANGUAGES

Japanese - Year Elective – 10JAP7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$65 per year
- Prerequisite: C grade or higher in Year 9 Japanese

If you would like to broaden life and career opportunities, travel the world, learn about and experience a rich culture and communicate in a popular language, then you may want to consider studying Japanese. You will develop spoken and written language skills to a point where you can communicate with others using Japanese language and experience the food and cultural elements of Japan.

TECHNOLOGIES

Design and Technologies

Computer Aided Drawing - Semester Elective – 10CAD7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$16 per semester

This course will develop students drawing skills using Industry Standard Autodesk software. Students will learn how to use the software to draw mechanical plans and 3D representations of products using industry conventions. It is highly advisable to take this course if you are interested in occupations such as Drafting and Engineering or any Mechanical or Fabrication Industry.

Metal Technology - Semester Elective – 10MET7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$120 per semester

A practical based subject including the use of Computer Aided Drawing software to design projects made predominantly from metal. Students will be expected to follow Occupational Health and Safety Legislation to safely use tools and machines commonly found in industry. A variety of welding and brazing processes will be taught along with use of lathes and bending equipment commonly found in the Metal Fabrication Industries. Developing hand skills will be a predominant focus in this course with the projects the students make varying according to their skill level and interest. This course will assist in preparing students to take on the General courses in Engineering Studies, Metalwork or Woodwork offered in Year 11 and 12.

Robotics - Semester Elective – 10ROB7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$50 per semester

Working in teams of three to five, students will be entered in the [Subs in Schools](#) or the [4x4 in Schools](#) Technology Challenges, run by the [Re-Engineering Australia](#) (REA) Foundation. Students will design, fabricate, assemble, test and perform modifications on either, a large underwater Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV), or a radio controlled 4x4 vehicle. As members of a simulated small business seeking to pitch their 'product' to industry, teams will also be required to market their vehicle, including design and construction of a Trade Display booth, production of an Engineering and Enterprise portfolio, and delivery of verbal presentations before a panel of judges.

Students will use 3D printers and laser cutters to fabricate components designed using Autodesk for their vehicle. Students will also develop skills in electronic systems through design and manufacture of printed circuit boards, installation and testing before proceeding to competition.

Wood Technology - Semester Elective – 10WDT7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$120 per semester

A practical based subject that includes the use of Computer Aided Drawing software to design projects made predominantly from wood. Students will be expected to learn and follow Occupational Health and Safety Legislation in the workplace to safely use tools and machines commonly found in the woodworking industry such as the band saw, router, biscuit cutter and drill press. The projects the students make vary according to their skill level and interest.

This course will assist in preparing students to take on the General courses in Engineering Studies, Metalwork or Woodwork offered in Year 11 and 12.

Digital Technologies

Information Communication Technology - Semester Elective – 10ICT7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$16 per semester

Students build on the skills gained in the Year 9 elective for example by delving deeper into graphics programming and animation, (including 3D). Students gain a fundamental understanding of the hardware component of IT, data storage, manipulation and management. Issues such as cybercrime, internet privacy, the ethical issues in IT and the impact of technology on the community are studied alongside the production of IT solutions to real world problems. Year 10 ICT provides a good foundation for Year 11 Applied Information Technology.

Home Economics

Café Foods – Semester 1 Elective – 10CAF7

- 2023 Course cost \$100 per semester

Year 10 Cafe Foods is the introduction to Hospitality and Food, Science and Technology – General, with students being able to develop basic kitchen skills required for the preparation and presentation of food as well as gaining an insight into cafe trends. Students will learn basic barista skills and prepare and present cafe style foods while working in small groups. Students will also learn the processes of choosing recipes, costing, ordering and preparing sweet and savoury recipes of their choice.

Entertaining with Food – Semester 2 Elective – 10ETF8

- 2023 Course cost \$100 per semester

This energetic elective involves students learning and practicing various cooking techniques to make both sweet and savoury recipes. New trends, ethical production and new technologies will be included in this course. The emphasis is on advanced food preparation skills which can lead the students into the Year 11 and 12 Certificate Courses and continue with a career in hospitality and catering. Students will experience and investigate a variety of recipes and prepare and design suitable choices for functions. They will also learn many aspects of hospitality and catering such as table service, table decoration, plating and garnishing.

Fashion - Semester Elective – 10FAS7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$100 per semester

This Fashion course is a continuation of the Year 9 course with a focus on current fashion trends and developing an individual style. Students will also investigate different styles and colours to suit different people. They will develop practical skills and knowledge as well as gain an insight into the fashion/clothing industry while using a variety of design techniques to construct items and express creativity. Students will also learn about the impact of clothing production on the environment and how to buy/make garments that are ethical. This course is suited to students with an interest in careers in Fashion design, Fashion coordinator, costume maker, wardrobe supervisor and visual merchandiser.

Textiles - Semester Elective – 10TEX7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$100 per semester

This textiles course is a continuation from the Year 9 Textiles course. Students will construct a variety of soft furnishings for their rooms and around the home using their own creative designs and styles. This course is a pathway to the Year 11 Textiles course and is suited to students with an interest in careers in fabric design, interior design, set design and craftsperson. Students will learn the relevant skills of using the sewing machine, hand stitching, overlocking and looking at new technologies to help with design and textile production.

The Developing Child - Semester Elective – 10TDC7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$80 per semester

This course is suitable for students who enjoy being around or are interested in working with infants and young children. A range of practical and interactive activities will assist students with the investigation of family structures, birth, caring for a newborn and the physical, social/emotional and cognitive development of a child over the first five years of life. The opportunity to care for an electronic RealCare baby, as part of a parenting simulation, will solidify some of the theoretical work completed in the course regarding skills that will assist students in caring for infants and young children. This course provides a solid foundation for students interested in studying Children, Family and Community - General or the Certificate II in Communities Services in Years 11 and 12.

THE ARTS

Class Music - Year Elective – 10MUS7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$80 per year

In this course, students cover a wide variety of genres, styles and topics related to music and are provided with an introduction to concepts related to contemporary music production, in a practical and interactive way. The course promotes exploration and creativity using current music technology and trends. Background in playing a musical instrument is required for this subject.

Dance 7 - Contemporary and Lyrical - Semester 1 Elective – 10DAN7

- 2023 Course cost \$16 per semester

The Contemporary and Lyrical Dance course introduces the students to new genres and choreography to popular music. There will be a focus on floor work, improvisation and group work plus contemporary technique. Students will improve their coordination, balance, strength and flexibility and have the opportunity to perform their Contemporary or Lyrical routine in front of a live audience.

Dance 8 - Hip Hop and Jazz - Semester 2 Elective – 10DAN8

- 2023 Course cost \$16 per semester

The Hip Hop & Jazz Dance course introduces the students to new genres and choreography to popular music. There will be a focus on Hip Hop styles such as tutting and breakdance, energetic choreography plus genre specific technique. Students will improve their coordination, balance, strength and flexibility and have the opportunity to perform their Hip Hop or Jazz routine in front of a live audience.

Drama - Semester Elective – 10DRA7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$16 per semester

This course covers a range of styles including Realist Theatre to Theatre of the Absurd and Street Theatre. Students will prepare and perform a variety of original and scripted pieces for performance. This course may include a professional theatre company production incursion/excursion that will incur an additional cost.

Graphic Design - Semester Elective – 10GRD7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$25 per semester

Using computers and tablets, students will learn the different techniques and ways that graphic designers create illustrations and manipulate photos and master font in Adobe programs. Access to drawing tablets, cameras, GoPros and much more. Unleash the designer within! This course will assist in preparing students to take on the design courses offered in Year 11 and 12.

Interactive Digital Design - Semester Elective – 10IDD7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$16 per semester

This course will provide students with a background meshing Media with Information Technology to do well in the Certificate II in Information, Digital Media and Technology. This course is recommended for students who have no background in Media but intend to enrol in Year 11 Certificate II in Information, Digital Media and Technology course. Students will explore photo manipulation in advertising, short film production, website design, website coding and team-orientated flash-based video game creation using the Adobe Suite (Photoshop, Premiere Pro, Dreamweaver and Flash). Where possible, students will have to market test their video games by organising a video game tournament to take place during lunchtime.

Media 7 - Documentaries and Film Subversion – Semester 1 Elective – 10MED7

- 2023 Course cost \$16 per semester

In Year 10 Media, students will create 60-second documentaries exploring interesting facets of human life. Following this focus, student then create a genre-flipped subversion of a film trailer, for example a remake of Mary Poppins as a Horror. Students are tasked with the creation of a 60-second documentary of their own, showcasing their special interests. Each student fulfils individual roles during pre-production, production, and post-production phases in their production groups. Students use the Canon 200 DSLR cameras and equipment to record in front of the Green Screen Kit. Students also learn to use Adobe Premiere Pro to edit out the Green Screen Kit and replace it with a suitable background relating to the topic to display their expertise.

Media 8 - Gaming Culture and Merchandise - Semester 2 Elective – 10MEG8

- 2023 Course cost \$16 per semester

Explore various aspects of gaming subculture that will culminate in the creation of an e-commerce website that displays items that are commonly sold to pander to gamers, such as themed t-shirts and sticker sets. Learn about new media concepts in the sphere of gaming such as the extension of self, symbolism, gender representation, and genre. Students will be using Adobe Dreamweaver to create their e-commerce websites. Adobe InDesign will be employed to portfolio student's t-shirt and sticker creation using Adobe Illustrator.

Mixing and Sampling Music - Semester Elective – 10MSM7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$35 per semester

Students develop their musical skills to create works of their own using software and technology. No instrumental skills are required but always beneficial. A keen ear for beat matching and blending will get you off and running! It is recommended that students have their own device that has appropriate software such as GarageBand that they can use which will enable work to be continued at home and provide students with the best opportunity to develop to their full potential.

Photography - Semester Elective – 10PHO7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$35 per semester

The photography course is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills required to produce photographic images of a high standard. If you enjoy the art of photography and would like to develop your skills this course is best suited for you.

Stage and Event Production - Semester Elective – 10SEP7/8

- 2023 Course cost \$25 per semester

Learn to control the lighting rigs and soundboards which are integral to creating an effective and amazing performance. Create sets and props for shows and develop skills in promoting and running events and performances. Come and explore the magic of 'back of stage' and all that goes on behind the scenes to make performances come alive!

Visual Art 2D - Semester 1 Elective – 10VA2

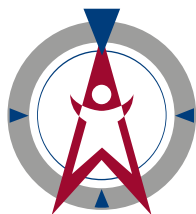
- 2023 Course cost \$50 per semester

Students will be involved in a range of Visual Arts 2 Dimensional artworks, including painting, printmaking and/or drawing. Students will investigate contemporary and historical artists in their artwork and will have the opportunity to display their work around the college.

Visual Art 3D - Semester 2 Elective – 10VA3

- 2023 Course cost \$50 per semester

Students will be involved in a range of Visual Arts 3 Dimensional artworks, including ceramics (clay) and/or sculpture. Students will investigate contemporary and historical artists in their artwork and will have the opportunity to display their work around the college.
